I also wanted to share with you a bit about what your child will learn with me this year.

The art program is designed to teach students creativity and introduce as well as continue to expose the children to a variety of art materials corresponding to the New York City Art Standards. Each grade has its own curriculum and challenging art projects that often relate to what they are learning with their classroom teacher. The children will be exposed to many different art mediums and art techniques including: painting, drawing, sculpture, collage and printmaking. The children will also be interpreting famous works of art, discussing and critiquing the techniques used and creating their own artwork using this knowledge. Grading is based solely on effort- not talent. It is more important to me that the children feel safe to experiment and try than to feel they must make art that is 'successful' each time. It is this freedom that creates thoughtful and talented artists.

Home work is rarely given, but when it is I expect it to be completed on time.
